### **History of the White Coat Ceremony**

The White Coat Ceremony was founded in 1993 by Dr. Arnold Gold, a teacher and pediatric neurologist at Columbia University's College of Physicians and Surgeons. While attending that year's commencement exercises, it became clear to Dr. Gold that the recitation of the Hippocratic Oath, whereby students accept the obligations of the medical profession, came four years too late. Students of the medical profession are bound by at least some of the same professional commitments that bind all doctors, and Dr. Gold felt that a ceremony affirming the new status of these students, as well as emphasizing the expectations and responsibilities appropriate for the medical profession, was necessary. These feelings served as the impetus for Dr. Gold's foundation to begin the advocacy and sponsorship of the White Coat Ceremony.

There are several essential components present in a White Coat Ceremony. Among them is an official welcome from the Dean, faculty, and other senior members of the school and the professional community, and the swearing of an oath, in the presence of family and friends, indicating the student's intention and willingness to assume the obligations and responsibilities of their chosen profession. Additionally, each student is presented with a ceremonial white coat by a mentor figure, representing their belief in this student's ability to carry on their profession.

Since its inception in 1993, the tradition of the White Coat Ceremony has spread beyond the walls of medical schools, and now takes place in dental schools, pharmacy schools, and other health professions schools worldwide. The White Coat Ceremony tradition began in 2007 at the Marquette University School of Dentistry. That tradition continues tonight.

## History of the Marquette University School of Dentistry

Marquette University School of Dentistry began as the Dental Department of the Milwaukee Medical College on September 26, 1894. On that day, there were 9 faculty members, 30 students, and a clinic consisting of 16 chairs.

In 1907, the Milwaukee Medical College affiliated with Marquette College, a Jesuit liberal arts school in the city of Milwaukee. With the addition of the Medical College's four academic units -medicine, dentistry, nursing, and pharmacy—Marquette College became Marquette University, and the future of the School of Dentistry was secured.

The School of Dentistry moved to its 16th Street location in 1923. That building housed a 150-chair clinic that was later expanded to 167 chairs, and earned the reputation as "the largest dental clinic under one roof" in the world. That clinic, together with its diagnosis laboratory, was praised as a pioneering effort in dental education, and attracted dental educators nationwide to Marquette.

The School of Dentistry moved into its current facility in 2002. With this change of venue, the School also introduced a new patient-based, student-centered curriculum that has continued Marquette's reputation as a leader in dental education.

Throughout the last 125 years, Marquette University School of Dentistry has been housed in three different buildings, provided over 3 million patient visits throughout Milwaukee, the state of Wisconsin, and the world, and graduated over 8500 dental professionals.

Tonight, we welcome the Class of 2023 as they join the rich history of Marquette University School of Dentistry.
