Medical History:
Patient’s medical history is significant for hypertension, coronary heart disease and cardiac bypass surgery over 10 years ago with no need for premedication. Patient is a past tobacco smoker. Patient has a history of sinusitis and well controlled type II diabetes with a last reported HbA1c less than 7. Patient also has vision and hearing impairment.
Dental History:
Patient has received regular dental care before presenting to MUSoD and has a history of extractions, periodontal treatment including S/RP and free gingival grafting procedures. Patient has also had endodontic treatment, fixed prosthetics including bridges, crowns, and implant at site 12.
Radiographic Findings:
Generalized bone loss, reduced clinical attachment in mandibular anteriors, bilateral pneumatized maxillary sinus, mucus retention cyst in right maxillary sinus,
Clinical Findings:
Unesthetic resins #8 and #9 MF, perimplant mucositis site #12, mobility #23, 24, 25, 26, recurrent carries, #30 and #32
Periodontal Findings:
Generalized recession, lack of clinical attachment on #23,24,25,26, PD - WNL, soft tissue - WNL
Periodontal Diagnosis:
Generalized moderate chronic periodontitis, #12 – peri-implant mucositis
Problem List:
Failing bridge, abrasion/abfraction, pneumatized maxillary sinuses, caries, missing teeth
